Monster Phonics

Year 1

Term 1 teaches the National Curriculum Year 1 graphemes (tch, ve, ay, oy, a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e, u-e, u-e, ea, ea, ir, oe, ou, ow) plus revision of Reception digraphs and trigraphs. Skills focus on blending and segmenting of decodable words alongside the reading and spelling of the Year 1 CEWs and the first 100 HFWs. Suffixes ed, s/es, ing, er and est (with no change to the root word) are also introduced in specific spelling lessons and then reinforced in grapheme lessons. Progression is cumulative with each lesson focusing only on decodable words that use graphemes that have been taught so far.

Year 2

Term 1 teaches all National Curriculum Year 2 graphemes, the Year 2 CEWs and the majority of the spelling rules, including the rules for adding vowel suffixes: the drop e, double consonant and y to an i rule. Homophones/near homophone are also taught in Term 1.
